

Adobe Photoshop

The Work Area

Toolbox, Tool Options, Menu Bar, Palettes

File → Open → Yumbarra

Cropping an image

Crop out Human-Bean 2001

Select Crop Tool from the Toolbox [left part of screen]

Click and drag across the part of the image you want to keep [appears as dashed line]

Select Image from the Menu Bar [top part of screen] → Crop

Undo Edit from Menu Bar → Step Backward (as many times as you need)

Making a Copy Image → Duplicate (Repeat 3 times)

Changing the Color (Copy 1)

Black & White: Image → Adjustments → Desaturate

Sepia: Desaturate first. Image → Adjustments → Color balance
Increase Red & Yellow

Filters (Copy 2)

Select image or part of an image

Filter → Filter Gallery [Click on folder icons to expand]

Artistic – smudge stick

Selecting Objects (Copy 3)

The Magic Wand Tool

In the Magic Wand Tool Options palette (below the menu bar), set tolerance to 50

Select the black part of the picture

To move the trees select the Move tool, position over trees and drag

Resize by selecting Edit → Free Transform. Resize like any other graphic

Apply transform if asked

Adding Text

Select Type Tool and click on left part of image

In the options palette, select font (Lucida Sans, Demibold Roman), size (24 pt) and center alignment

Type Yumbarra Conservation Park on two separate lines

Select text and change color to white or gray

Warp Text

Using the Type Tool, highlight the text and right click

Choose Warp Text and select “Squeeze”

Selecting Layers

Choose Text layer from bottom right menu
Choose Move tool
Drag text to bottom right part of picture
File → Save as Yumbarra 2
Change Format to jpeg (OK for high quality)

Blending Images

Open Gettysburg.jpg and soldier.jpg. They will open in two windows.
With Soldier selected (you can tell by the layers feature in the bottom right), crop everything except the soldier.
Select (in the main menu) All. Edit → Copy.
Select Gettysburg and Edit → Paste
Select Soldier. In the bottom right Layers, Change Opacity to 40%
Edit → Free Transform. Resize so he is in proportion to the landscape.
Use the eraser tool to remove some of the background
Use the move tool to reposition.
User smudge tool (right click drop of water) and blend the edges.
File → Save As Ghost

Cloning

File → Open Dalmation.jpg
Select Clone Stamp Tool (looks like a stamp)
Alt-Click on the face of the smallest dog
Click and drag back and forth in the blank red space on the right. A new dog will appear

Magic Wand and Paint Bucket

Select Magic Wand Tool and Set Tolerance (below menu bar) to 100
Select the top red background (it will get a wavy border)
Select the Paint Bucket Tool. (You may need to right-click the gradient tool for Paint Bucket). Change foreground color to blue (two overlapping squares of color)
Pour paint by clicking area again. Repeat as necessary.
Manipulate new backgrounds using filters.

Image Size

Image → Image Size
Pixels or inches: Constrained by proportions. Prevents distorted images.
Crop Tool – Front Image. Set width and height. Crop – click and drag across image.
Image → Crop
